Enjoy the coming year with SCWA!






At last we have created an <u>SCWA Bookstore</u> to feature books by our talented members in the Member Bookstore tab on the website. We'd love for you to be a part of it.

https://www.authorspublish.com/, assembles monthly lists of themed submission calls by magazines and journals, often paying for your work. Even a modest payment is at least encouragement and can add to your portfolio.



- Publishing ... and Other Forms of Insanity, the newsletter for the website Published to Death, sends a monthly list of writers' conferences, fee free contests, and agents for all genres who are looking for submissions.
- For emerging writers, establishing a publications resume can be quite a
 challenge, especially if you have never published any of your work. But
 there always has to be a first—your very first short story, poem or
 personal essay published by a literary magazine.

Take heart, new writers! There are magazines that want your work and will even pay you for it.

Also see: Mega-List of Science Fiction and Fantasy Magazines-Paying markets—Many speculative fiction magazines are happy to publish emerging writers.
