HIGHLIGHTS: Featured Speaker for September 2021 David Corbett Compelling, Emotional Character Motivation

Motivation—the foundation of every great novel.





SCWA Highlights, Sept. 18, 2021

Compelling, Emotional Character Motivation: Defining It. Believing It. Writing It! with David Corbett

What makes a great novel? "The foundation of every great novel," author David Corbett says, "is the main character and his/her development." Readers will identify with that character and learn how someone finds his/her "soul, purpose, or destiny." Corbett has published six novels, one of which is *The Long-Lost Love Letters of Doc Holliday*, 2018, two textbooks, short fiction, and poetry. (References below.)

At the start of a novel the character is in "a state of lack" because something is missing. This lack affects him/her daily in exterior ways such as work or lifestyle, in interior ways as in his sense of identity, and in his personal connections. Sometimes, however, he's not totally aware of how stressed he is over this lack. His lethargy and other emotions coat it or swallow it up.

Mr. Corbett says the character's yearning relates "to what he believes his life is truly about: the way of life he wants to live, the kind of person he hopes to be." Corbett tells writers to "conceptualize that yearning without putting in one word for it." Often what someone wants must be experienced in some intuitive way because words can be too limited. Corbett says he picks music that sounds like where the character wants to go. A character can even be enlightened or inspired by a painting. The writer needs to portray why the protagonist is unfilled. Corbett lists the following problems:

- *Weaknesses*: laziness, cowardice, lack of confidence, cynicism, despair.
- *Wounds*: Some loss or injury that has crippled the individual's ability to love, heal, or act decisively. A trauma has given him/her a sense of meaninglessness. [Why does it matter?] In the film *Casablanca*, the protagonist [Humphrey Bogart] finds. the love of his life, but she leaves him. He becomes bitter and cynical.
- *Limitations*: youth, old age, inexperience, lack of intelligence, poor health, poverty, friends who have a diminished sense of self.
- *Opposition*: a countering external force, normally embodied in another person—a dream- killing father, over-protective mother, undermining teachers, slacker friends, a snobbish society, an oppressive community; or it may take the form of a demanding obligation, like the need to be a responsible parent, or a caretaker for someone in need.
- *Flaws*: a hard or bitter moral fault that hurts others: selfishness, deceitfulness, indifference, cruelty, greed, a willingness to manipulate others.

Where in the character's past does the writer look to pin down the problem? Corbett says to find the "greatest moment of sorrow (example: when he was nine years old, his brother died) or fame or greatest joy (a moment of great love). What were the moments of helplessness—where he/she was frozen in time? What about fear, shame (lessens your sense of self)), guilt (maybe harmed someone else), greatest betrayal (where "the earth comes undone beneath them") and the question is "whom can I trust?") It could also be a moment of the greatest forgiveness.

Warning: Corbett advises writers to utilize only three happenings from the backstory or the present time to show the character's problem.

Then *something happens*—the loved one appears, a body is found, the expedition is launched, the car breaks down in the middle of nowhere and that opportunity or misfortune triggers the *desire* to respond or to act. "The term Stubborn Virtues refers to those habits of behavior that continue to provide hope that pursuit of the promise of life—the Yearning—is not misguided."

Writers must remember to show the character's problems and his habitual behaviors in the little and big ways he acts to protect himself

"from the pain of life." At the beginning of every scene, what's the most natural thing this character would be doing? Our speaker listed the following:

- 1. The Resistance is embodied in <u>behavior</u>.
- 2. How the character is "ruining his life" on a day-to-day basis through denial, evasion, laziness, indifference, self-undermining, false modesty, manipulation, over-aggression, greed, cruelty. *Think in terms of scenes*.
- 3. Ask the question: What does the character do that "ruins his life." (Important: It may also be what the character does not do, neglects to do, or refuses to do that ruins his life—but understand and visualize that failure to act as a kind of action.)
- 4. When and how does the character realize the destructive nature of this behavior?
- 5. This is the behavior that must be rectified for the character to achieve his Desire and fulfill his Yearning, i.e., to "win" his inner struggle. (Discovery => Change)
- 6. By rooting backstory in behavior, you provide a dramatic means to portray the character's transformation: At the story's beginning he did that. After all his intensifying struggles and the discovery that they led to, he now does this.

Dave Corbett highly recommends reading Stephen Pressfield's *The War of Art.* Corbett's two excellent textbooks are *The Art of Character*, published by Penguin. His follow-up, *The Compass of Character*, was published by Writer's Digest in October 2019. He is a popular speaker and has also taught through the UCLA Extension's Writers' Program and at numerous writing conferences across the United States, Canada, and Mexico. David Corbett (he/him) is the author of six novels, including 2018's *The Long-Lost Love Letters of Doc Holliday*. His short fiction and poetry have appeared in a broad array of magazines and anthologies, with pieces twice selected for Best American Mystery Stories, and his non-fiction has appeared in numerous venues, including the *New York Times, San Francisco Chronicle, Narrative, Zyzzyva, MovieMaker, The Writer*, and *Writer's Digest* (where he is a contributing editor).

His textbook *The Art of Character* was published by Penguin. Writer's Digest published his follow-up, *The Compass of Character*, in October 2019.


