## President's Message for June 2023 from Larry Porricelli

#### VICTORY CRAYNE



Victory Crayne, past president of SCWA, passed away recently. I felt it was important to share the tale of Victory and her bravado and fortitude to bring SCWA into its fullness—and the role SCWA has played in so many writers lives—all because she stood when it mattered and had a vision that we still have.

I met Victory as a visitor to SCWA, and the speaker at that meeting was wonderful. However, the meeting went four hours, and the man in charge was overbearing, demeaning, and a bully to the gathering, which was mostly women.

I was a guest of a woman I was seeing, and we sat at the same table as Victory, and during our lo-o-o-o-ng time together we shared our thoughts on the meeting. I said I probably wouldn't return, as I couldn't believe anyone would stand for the man's behaviors.

Victory had similar feelings; and she said all we could do was run against him in an election, even though he controlled the group. So, what the hell, we gave it a go, and we sent each member an outline of Victory's ideas and goals-particularly to help authors finish a work and be published, which most members at the time had not.

Victory held small coffee and wine meetings, sharing her thoughts away from the meetings, and inviting people to share their ideas. It was very well received, in fact so well received, the abusive man in charge resigned abruptly and Victory won an overwhelming victory. First thing, Victory put a Vice President in charge of monthly speakers who went after real writers to bring inspiration to the group. Consequently, Ray Bradbury, Dean Devlin, Darlene Quinn, and many other noted writers and editors shared their wisdom and experiences with SCWA. Soon SCWA was being sought by noted writers themselves who asked if they could be fit into SCWA's schedule.

Victory put a premium on being a member of SCWA, and we had well over 200 members, as she constantly made writers aware that they were the sole purpose of SCWA. This is our same mission to this day.

It may sound somewhat tame today, but 25 years ago, Victory's courage stood for women and men as an example of fighting abuse. (The man mentioned was of the "me too" generation, and several times Victory stated that if he won the election, she was "going to knock him out.")

The salacious side of me perhaps may have enjoyed the whupping she would have put on the old goat, but she didn't need to, he left out the back door.

Victory insisted on inviting interesting and valuable speakers-not marketers



hawking their conferences and sales pitches but writers of value. And in the tradition of the Algonquin Round Table, all done over a meal, as we fellowshipped at tables and shared our common causes, victories, and failures.

From this grew perhaps a most valuable characteristic of SCWA—we all feel we stand arm in arm with each other and we all do anything we can to assist other

members in their efforts. I see this continuously—from editing to marketing to simply putting an arm around a fellow writer. We are one, and I say thank you to Victory Crayne for leading the way.






## HIGHLIGHTS May 2023 Speaker GREG HURWITZ Writing a Bestselling Thriller, Over and Over




\*\*Note: At Mr. Hurwitz's request, no audio or recordings were made at this event. Speaker highlights will appear as usual in the next newsletter.

**GREGG HURWITZ** is the *New York Times #1* internationally bestselling author of twenty thrillers including *OUT OF THE DARK* (January 2019). His novels have won numerous literary awards and have been published in thirty languages. Additionally, he's written screenplays and television scripts for many of the major studios and networks. Gregg lives with his two Rhodesian ridgebacks in Los Angeles, where he continues to play soccer, frequently injuring himself.



Paramount Players has optioned eight novels from Hurwitz's Marked Man series of books, with plans to adapt them for a series of feature films. Hurwitz will produce the films alongside Emmy winner Scott Frank, producer of Netflix's *The Queen's Gambit*.
