Featured July 2023 Speaker: Baron Birtcher with Steve Wood Poetry in Motion: Putting Emotion on the Page



Want to elevate your prose? Find the heart of your story? Set your book apart from the rest? Join us Saturday, July 15, at 10:00 am when award-winning author Baron Birtcher—master of creating razor sharp literary genre fiction-talks with award-winning recording artist/songwriter, Steve Wood (founder of the band Honk, film-score writer, and bandleader for Kenny Loggins—among others). Baron will share insights infusing emotion into words when writing prose, then get Steve's take on how one approaches the same subject when writing poetry or music. Together they will discusshow their approaches can be incorporated into writing evocative prose.

Baron Birtcher is the *Los Angeles Times* and IMBA bestselling author of the hardboiled Mike Travis series (*Roadhouse Blues, Ruby Tuesday, Angels Fall,* and *Hard Latitudes*), the award-winning Ty Dawson series (*South California Purples, Fistful Of Rain,* and *Reckoning*), as well as the critically lauded stand-alone, *Rain Dogs.* Baron is a five-time winner of the Silver Falchion Award, and the winner of 2018's Killer Nashville Readers Choice Award, as well as 2019's Best Book of the Year for *Fistful Of Rain.*

He has also had the honor of having been named a finalist for the Nero Award, the Lefty Award, the Foreword Indie Award, the 2016 Best Book Award, the Pacific Northwest's regional Spotted Owl Award and the Claymore Award.

Steve Wood was a former member of the 1970s Southern California rock band Honk. Honk's first album was the soundtrack to the surfing movie *Five Summer Stories*, which was made by MacGillivray-Freeman Films—who are now famous for making the IMAX films, for which Steve Wood composes music.



HIGHLIGHTS June 2023 Speaker Dr. Cristina LePort Writing and the Subconscious



Writing and the Subconscious
with Physician and Thriller Writer,
Dr. Cristina LePort

Medicine and fiction are the inseparable passions of Cristina LePort, M.D. that are the basis of her medical thrillers. After practicing Internal Medicine for seventeen years and about to get a Cardiology fellowship, she began listening to Ayn Rand's lectures from *The Art of Fiction* because she had always wanted to write.

The result was the publication of *Dissection*, a medical and political thriller, in October 2022. In it, a heart surgeon suddenly has many heart attack and stroke patients. Earlier, all of these victims had received cards that declared, "Your heart attack stroke will arrive within one hour!" If that line does doesn't capture readers, what can? In one of the thriller's reviews, award-winning author D. P. Lyle was quoted as saying, "Don't start *Dissection* at night—its pace never lets up and you need your sleep." SCWA member Lyle was present with us for LePort's presentation. In Amazon Kindle, *Dissection* is the number one Best Seller in political thrillers and suspense books.

LePort says inspiration is not innate. For example, if you needed to write about the sunrise you could—because you have "lots of knowledge going into it" and you need lots of mood. However, you need also to "call on your story knowledge that has become unconscious." In other words, your "conscious mind has a limited screen of vision" compared to what your unconscious mind has. But when the two connect in a relationship, you gain inspiration— "as if it's from God." Our speaker says, "Learn how to make it happen. Learn where it comes from."

Thus, "your subconscious is the summing up of your premises and the goals you have set for yourself, the purpose." "We have to consciously work with your subconscious." The bigger the extent of your knowledge stored there, the more your premise will drive your inspiration.

"Literary premises are all in your subconscious," says LePort. Ask yourself, "What are *proper* literary premises?" "Your main tools are <u>words</u>." Think of words that are concretes—that represent real objects and things in the world that can help symbolize feelings or factors in your story—such as freedom or fear or other concepts. If you need a table in a scene, for instance, what kind of table (or other items) could reflect family warmth, family separation, authority, poverty, etc.? She says to store them in your subconscious. Wherever someone is in your story, what representative things are nearby?

Analyze the parts of your script you like or don't like. How are they connected to "past conclusions of yours that support your present thinking: philosophical premises, reality, consciousness, the relationship of man and the universe, cause and effect, and free will?" LePort asked if maybe we have bad philosophical premises and commented that because she grew up Catholic, she had to change some of her premises. Now, "I can choose my action." She says it's bad if she lapses "into the malevolent universe." "A painting," she said, "of a beautiful woman with a pimple on her lip is the malevolent universe coming through."

For your plot and theme, you need "a purposeful progression of events, logically connected, leading to the climax. Always keep the theme in mind." "You need to believe in free will; without it, there's no plot." We all "read to relate to ourselves." So, if there's no free will, "the book won't make a difference to" your reader. (Another suggestion: "Make the worst obstacle you can in the climate.) "The theme is the conscious purpose by which the subconscious chooses details." LePort says that at the beginning of her stories, she already knows the end.

Cristina LePort is the chief medical officer and co-founder of Genescient, a biotech company devoted to genetic research on aging and the amelioration of chronic diseases. She, her husband, a general surgeon, and family live in Orange County.
