HIGHLIGHTS July 2023 Speaker Baron Birtcher and Steve Wood Poetry in Motion

SCWA Highlights 7-15-23. Baron Birtcher and Steve Wood

Poetry in Motion and Putting Emotion on the Page



"This is my favorite group to talk to. You guys are serious, dedicated writers," declared Baron Birtcher, award winner and master of "creating razorsharp literary genre fiction." Next to him was his colleague Steve Wood, song composer and the winner of nine Best Score Awards for film music. Birtcher then asked the SCWA audience, "How many of you have published?" When the majority of hands went up, Birtcher and Wood cheered with the audience.

Birtcher began. Writing is "putting authentic emotion on the page." Its "cornerstone is authenticity." When Ernest Hemingway was once asked how he became "a wonderful writer," his answer was "First, I lived." Birtcher also emphasized how important tone is. It takes a lot of self-examination to portray the emotion properly and the tone authentic and match the story and yet be consistent to itself.

Birtcher's latest novel, *Reckoning*, comes out this September (2023). He likes to "set a book's tone and guardrails" for the story and for himself. He quoted, "No child in this world is born with a knowledge of evil—until the day evil catches up with all of us and comes down like a God-damn hammer."

In addition, Birtcher said, "I have a title before I start, so each chapter, etc., has the same tone, moods, ups and downs." "I create a soundtrack—a playlist for myself, so I can stay with themes and tones." When writing a novel set in the 1970s, he played music from that period. (However, he doesn't listen to music while he's actually writing.) Birtcher was formerly a musician.

Steve Wood is one of the founders and members of the legendary band <code>Honk</code> and also toured with the Beach Boys and with Paul McCartney. He's extensively composed music for IMAX films. He and Birtcher discussed craft. Wood says, "Music is in a lizard part of your brain—more so than tempo. There's something primitive about it." He says that it's hard (for him) to create with just words; you need the music [sounds, melody]. Birtcher interjected that Wood is from the "School of the Pure Music." Wood responded, "Creating the music is easy for me. Music tells you something emotional." But this veteran music maker admits that it can take weeks or months for the lyrics to be clear for him.

Wood explained that "as you age, you become more emotionally connected with things because you go through all this stuff. However, testosterone makes you care less of other people's feelings. If it were not natural, testosterone wouldn't be legal."

In Wood's profession of creating music for others, he's had to go along with the singer's goal—even if it's a narrow window. But for the writer, "You have to break free of what you think you should be doing [with the music]." "Your soul has something in it, and it will tell you. Be quiet in your mind when composing; be ready for the quiet voice." "Then forming the plot and getting out of the way are part of the work." Birtcher says that word choices can set up a tone in a minor key. Wood sets his tone with lyrics. He also stresses that many things can get in your way—unless someone can help you get out of the way. Birtcher enthusiastically agreed.

Wood also wrote music for himself while working for others. Without development time, "my own stuff got stuffed in a junk drawer." But since retirement, he's been able pursue his own voice. Wood's creation of "Bird Song" was played in the auditorium for SCWA. He called it the "coolest little blues rip," a remarkable recording of hundreds, if not thousands of miscellaneous birds in a lake and forest area chirping and calling amongst each other—lightly overlaid with a melody by Wood. He said it's "an example of letting something else come into you--and then making something else out of it." Wood now has an album out entitled *Junk Drawer*.

When a scene opens in a novel, "something looks happy, but something bad is going to happen." Birtcher says he doesn't "hear" anything about his plot but works with word choice because, although he's a former musician, he's not at the level of music that Wood is. "I wish I knew the 'language of music.'" Although if it's an action scene, Birtcher says he makes it staccato—"brief and quick—to get the heart rate going."

Then Maddie Margarita asked if Birtcher uses "an emotional map? Bridge, hook, chorus?" I absolutely do," he said. "I'm an inveterate plotter, rather than a pantser, and with emotion. Only three emotional scenes in a row. Too hard to slog through." Wood added, "Sometimes the sounds come first to you and sometimes the lyrics."

Regarding marketing, Wood said the songs that creatively come all at once are probably the most marketable. That's because they don't get "all that twisty" with the creator's complexities.

Besides writing for the 1970s Southern California rock band Honk, film-score writer Steve Wood was a critical ingredient in Honk's first album, the soundtrack to the surfing movie *Five Summer Stories*. He's also been the bandleader for Kenny Loggins—among others, when not busy with IMAX. Baron Birtcher has won numerous awards, including 2019's Best Book of the Year for *Fistful of Rain*. His hardboiled Mike Travis series includes *Roadhouse Blues, Ruby Tuesday, Angels Fall*, and *Hard Latitudes*. His award-winning Ty Dawson series includes *South California Purples*, *A Fistful of Rain*, and his latest, *Reckoning*. A critically lauded stand-alone is *Rain Dogs*.

At the end of the session, the SCWA crowd applauded as President Porricelli gave both speakers a big bottle of wine named "Dramatic."
